Don't forget that we also lists clubs who have worked with us as well as auction houses who have agreed to permit us to use the lovely colored photographs from their catalogs.

Our Advisory Board lists only names and partial addresses, so check the Directory for addresses and telephone numbers should you want to correspond with one of our experts. We list an international Advisory Board; so remember, when you do contact them, *always* enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope (SASE) when inquiring within the United States. Thousands of people buy our guide, and hundreds contact our advisors. The only agreement we have with our advisors is that they edit their categories. They are in no way obligated to answer mail. Many of these people are very busy, spending much time on the road. Time at home is always precious, and they may not be open to contacts. There's no doubt that the reason behind the success of our book is their assistance. We regret seeing them becoming more and more burdened by phone and mail inquiries. We have lost some of our good advisors for this reason, and when we do, the book suffers and consequently, so do our readers. Many of our listed reference sources report that they constantly receive long distance calls (at all hours) that are really valuation requests. If they are registered appraisers, they make their living at providing such information and expect a fee for their service and expertise.

Since *Schroeder's* cannot provide all available information on antiques and collectibles, there are other sources available that you may want to pursue. The local library is always a good place to start. Check their section on reference books. I'm sure you will find many Collector Books books there. Museums are public facilities that are willing and able help you establish the origin and possibly even the value of your particular treasure. A more recent source of information includes the world of e-commerce, where many websites provide pertinent, up-to-date information. Another alternative is the yellow pages of your phone book. Other cities' phone books are available from either your library or from the telephone company office. The Antique Dealers heading in the yellow pages is a good place to start. Look for qualified appraisers (this may be mentioned in their advertisement). Always remember that a dealer buying your merchandise will set a price low enough that he will be able to make a reasonable profit when the item is sold. Once you decide to contact one of these appraisers, unless you intend to see them directly, you'll need to take photographs. Don't send photos that are under- or over-exposed, out of focus, or shot against a background that detracts from important details you want to emphasize. It is almost impossible for them to give you a value judgement on items they've not seen when your photos are of poor quality. Shoot the front, top, and the bottom; describe any marks and numbers (or send a pencil rubbing); explain how and when you acquired the article; and give accurate measurements and any further background information that may be helpful.

The section of the Directory titled Auction Houses includes auctions houses whose catalogs have been used for pricing information. Nearly all have appraisal experts on staff. If the item you're attempting to research is of the caliber of items

Book of Knowledge

Book of Knowledge Banks were produced by John Wright (Pennsylvania) from circa 1950 until 1975. Of the 30 models they made during those years, a few continued to be made in very limited numbers until the late 1980s; these they referred to as the 'Medallion' series. (Today the Medallion banks command the same prices as the earlier Book of Knowledge series.) Each bank was a handcrafted, hand-painted duplicate of an original as was found in the collection of The Book of Knowledge, the first children's encyclopedia in this country. Because the antique banks are often priced out of the range of many of today's collectors, these banks are being sought out as affordable substitutes for their very expensive counterparts. It should also be noted that China has reproduced banks with the Book of Knowledge inscription on them. These copies are flooding the market, causing authentic Book of Knowledge banks to decline in value. Buyers should take extra caution when investing in Book of Knowledge banks and purchase them through a reputable dealer who offers a satisfaction guarantee as well as a guarantee that the bank is authentic. Cambridge Art Pottery

The Cambridge Art Pottery (not to be confused with the Cambridge Art Tile Works of Covington, Kentucky) was founded in 1901 in Cambridge, Ohio. Charles Upjohn, formerly from the Weller Pottery, was hired as designer and modeler. Cambridge would be known mostly for three artware lines: Terrhea, their variation of Rookwood's Standard Glaze line, underglaze painted with polychrome slips and covered in an amber overglaze; Oakwood, a flambe glaze mix of autumnal colors; and Acorn, a smooth and satiny matt green finish in the Arts and Crafts style. They also produced a commercially successful utilitarian line, Guernsey, named after the county for which Cambridge was the seat. After 1908 only the Guernsey line remained, so in 1909 the pottery name was changed to Guernsey Earthenware. Cambridge pieces are usually stamped with a CAP mark ('AP' within a larger 'C') with the name of the line above or below. Cambridge Glass

The Cambridge Glass Company began operations in 1901 in Cambridge, Ohio. Primarily they made crystal dinnerware and well-designed accessory pieces until the 1920s when they introduced the concept of color that was to become so popular on the American dinnerware mar-

ket. Always maintaining high standards of quality and elegance, they produced many lines that became bestsellers; through the '20s and '30s they were recognized as the largest manufacturer of this type of glassware in the world.

Of the various marks the company used, the 'C in triangle' is the most familiar. Production stopped in 1958. For a more thorough study of the subject, we recommend *Colors in Cambridge Glass* by the National Cambridge Collectors, Inc.; their address may be found in the Directory under Clubs. *Glass Animals, Second Edition*, by Dick and Pat Spencer is a wonderful source for an in-depth view of that particular aspect of glass collecting. Glidden

Genius designer Glidden Parker established Glidden Pottery in 1940 in Alfred, New York, having been schooled at the unrivaled New York State College of Ceramics at Alfred University. Glidden pottery is characterized by a fine stoneware body, innovative forms, outstanding hand-milled glazes, and hand decoration which make the pieces individual works of art. Production consisted of casual dinnerware, artware, and accessories that were distributed internationally.

In 1949 Glidden Pottery became the second ceramic plant in the country to utilize the revolutionary Ram pressing machine. This allowed for increased production and for the most part eliminated the previously used slip-casting method. However, Glidden stoneware continued to reflect the same superb quality of craftsmanship until the factory closed in 1957. Although the majority of form and decorative patterns were

Mr. Parker's personal designs, Fong Chow and Sergio Dello Strologo also designed award-winning lines.

Glidden will be found marked on the unglazed underside with a signature that is hand incised, mold impressed, or ink stamped. Fur clips are two-pronged, used to anchor fur stoles. Dress clips have a spring clasp and are used at the dress neckline. Look for signed and well-made, unmarked pieces for your collections and preserve this American art form. Libbey

The New England Glass Company was established in 1818 in Boston, Massachusetts. In 1892 it became known as the Libbey Glass Company. At Chicago's Columbian Expo in 1893, Libbey set up a 10-pot furnace and made glass souvenirs. The display brought them worldwide fame. Between 1878 and 1918, Libbey made exquisite cut and faceted glass, considered today to be the best from the brilliant period. The company is credited for several innovations — the Owens bottle machine that made mass production possible and the Westlake machine which turned out both electric light bulbs and tumblers automatically. They developed a machine to polish the rims of their tumblers in such a way that chipping was unlikely to occur. Their glassware carried the patented Safedge guarantee. Libbey also made glassware in numerous colors, among them cobalt, ruby, pink, green, and amber. Our advisors for this category are Don and Anne Kier; they are listed in the Directory under Ohio.
